



THE AMERICAN WAY OF DEATH IN **FOOTBALL CONDITIONING**

By now, football's concussion crisis is well known: every year brings headlines of our Hall of Fame heroes behaving erratically and dying young. But did you know that several kid players across the continent drop dead every year before a single ball is snapped — just from extreme conditioning drills directed by all-powerful coaches? Without Helmets or Shoulder Pads takes the conversation about football and public health to a new level with investigations of the sport's underreported worst tragedies and their cover-ups, at major universities, obscure junior colleges, and high schools. These add up to a kind of quiet pandemic — a socially induced one enabled by our thirst for spectacle and by a skewed vision of masculinity.

Here are the shocking stories of young men who get struck down by exertional heatstroke and other causes sometimes not even acknowledged (such as the sickle cell trait syndrome that afflicts many African Americans). When the worst happens, the football world simply buries the evidence, pays off victims' families, and moves on.


No matter how much we enjoy America's most popular sport at elite levels, this book makes the case that it belongs out of our public schools and off our public fields.



Going from a hobby toy for surfers to an Olympic sport, skateboarding has had a tumultuous history. Today, professional skateboarders land endorsement deals with Nike and Adidas, while popular television series like HBO's *Betty* tell the stories of diverse crews of skaters living in New York City. So how did a fledgling subculture rise from its near-death knell in the '90s to become ubiquitous today? It was simply a matter of finding the right messenger.





A granddaughter explores the story of her Ukrainian grandmother's survival of Hitler's forced labor camps

Irina Nikifortchuk was 19 years old and a Ukrainian schoolteacher when she was abducted to be a forced laborer in the Leica camera factory in Nazi Germany. Eventually pulled from the camp hospital to work as a domestic in the Leica owners' household, Irina survived the war and eventually found her way to Canada.


Decades later Sasha Colby, Irina's granddaughter, seeks out her grandmother's story over a series of summer visits and gradually begins to interweave the as-told-to story with historical research. As she delves deeper into the history of the Leica factory and World War II forced labor, she discovers the parallel story of Elsie Kühn-Leitz, Irina's rescuer and the factory heiress, later imprisoned and interrogated by the Gestapo on charges of "excessive humanity."

This is creative nonfiction at its best as the mystery of Irina's life unspools skillfully and arrestingly. Despite the horrors that the story must tell, it is full of life, humor, food, and the joy of ordinary safety in Canada. The Matryoshka Memoirs takes us into a forgotten corner of history, weaving a rich and satisfying tapestry of survival and family ties and asking what we owe those who aid us.

Sasha Colby is a writer, literary historian, performance artist, and director of Simon Fraser University's Graduate Liberal Studies program. She lives in Vancouver, BC.



- **AUTHORITATIVE, YET ACCESSIBLE:** Working from multiple sources, including Elsie Kühn-Leitz's (the Leica Camera heiress) 1947 autobiographical essay, Sasha Colby has pieced together the story of the Leitz family's ambiguous tale of Nazi profit and resistance, the murder-mystery surrounding Elsie Kühn-Leitz's denunciation, and her three-month imprisonment in Frankfurt's notorious Gestapo women's prison.
- WRITTEN WITH DEEP EMPATHY AND PERSONAL KNOWLEDGE: This is framed by a kitchenmemoir/oral history as told by Colby's maternal grandmother, Irina Kylynych, who worked in the Leica factory as a Nazi-deported Ukrainian forced-laborer. The book is a multigenerational portrait of inherited memory. It tells the relatively unknown story of the Leitz family, the Third Reich's use of female forced labor, and its women's prisons. Ultimately it is an interconnected story of survival, resilience, and the ways the World War II past continues to act on our own moment.
- **VERY LITTLE WRITTEN:** There has been very little written about the Leitz family, or Elise Kuehn-Leitz, despite the fact that she helped smuggle hundreds of Jewish people out of Nazi Germany before the Holocaust. The Leitz family quietly established what is now known as the "Leica Freedom Train," which covertly assigned Jewish employees overseas before Nazi Germany closed its borders in 1939. After the war, Elise received numerous honors for her humanitarian efforts, including the Officier d'honneur des Palmes académiques from France in 1965.

Farhang honors the people, places, and things Patrick Woodcock has seen while working as a migrant writer, volunteer, and teacher for almost three decades. This book is the first of three that will celebrate, memorialize, or eulogize the myriad moments that impacted his life while also shaping the shade and content of his writing. Beginning in Poland in 1994 and ending in the hamlet of Paulatuk in the Northwest Territories in 2022, Farhang travels the globe through Lithuania, Russia, Iceland, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Colombia, the Kurdish North of Iraq, Azerbaijan, Tanzania, Kenya, and Rwanda. The ECW office is situated on land that was the traditional territory of many nations including the Wendat, the Anishnaabeg, Haudenosaunee, Chippewa, Métis, and the Mississaugas of the Credit, the latter of whom completed negotiation of a Treaty No. 13 known as the "Toronto Purchase" begun in 1787, negotiated in 1805, and re-negotiated in 2010.
