Hogbook and Lazer Eyes


Fans of Maria Bamford's acclaimed quasiautobiographical *Lady Dynamite* Netflix series already know of her romance with LA painter Scott Marvel Cassidy, as well as her droll pug sidekicks Blueberry and Bert. Now the story has been recounted in the graphic novella *Hogbook and Lazer Eyes*, written by Bamford/ Cassidy, drawn by Cassidy, and all told by the rescue dogs they've adopted.

For those unfamiliar with the story, newly single fortysomethings Maria Bamford and Scott Cassidy each signed up on the dating site OkCupid, under the respective usernames "Hogbook" and "Lazer Eyes." They went on a date, and then another, and soon, despite a history of Bipolar II disorder and unhealthy relationships for each of them, they fell in love and were married in 2015. We view all of this through the

prism of their pug housemates, including Blueberry and Bert (who has an unnatural obsession with Michael Flatley of "Riverdance" fame), and the elderly bonded pair Betty and Arnold (who recount their star turn as interplanetary canine scientists in the second season of *Lady Dynamite*).

Cassidy's fine art training translates with ease into graphic storytelling, with a naturalistic illustrative style that is a pitch-perfect match for Bamford's comic timing, making *Hogbook and Lazer Eyes* a beautifully illustrated love story, told by some incredibly charming pugs.








Salome's Last Dance

An absurdist, psychedelic crime fantasy / graphic novella from an acclaimed artist and printmaker.

The Astounding Magnus has been hypnotizing audiences at the Feedbag cocktail bar with his resplendent dancing dog act, Salome, and her "Serpentine Dance of the Seven Veils." Yet despite his success, the pearl of life has lost its luster for Magnus. He visits the psychologist, Dr. Silkini, who promises to massage Magnus's id into a higher dimension: the pearly gates of full life satisfaction. Meanwhile, Salome's crowd-pleasing performances have attracted unwanted attention from sinister forces who want to know the dog's secret.

Daria Tessler's new graphic novella, *Salome's Last Dance*, show-cases her phenomenal talent for incorporating elements of collage and pen-and-ink illustration to create a beautifully phantasmagoric experience under the guise of an absurdist, psychedelic fantasy (including an extended visual tour de force depicting a hallucinogenic tea trip), one that favorably compares to *Yellow Submarine* or

the comics of Jim Woodring. Tessler's rich ear for language and sharp sense of humor also liven every inventively stunning page of *Salome's Last Dance*.

Born in Finland, **DARIA TESSLER** is a cartoonist and printmaker based in Portland, OR. Her books include *Cult of the Ibis, Loop of the Sun,* and *Music of Changes*. She also creates silkscreen prints, stationary, and more that can be found on her website animalsleepstories.com.



Daughters of Snow and Cinders

Princess Mononoke meets Jack London in this gritty, ecofeminist adventure.

Fleeing the fires of her war-torn homeland, a young woman travels to the New World in search of gold to rebuild her life. In this strange, lawless land, Joana encounters friends (the kind Native women Tala and Opa), foes (the cruel gold hunter Matwei and his men), and an unexpected traveling companion who may just be her good luck charm — and amidst the icy reaches of the wilderness, a fearsome fantastical beast lurks in the shadows.

The English debut of Spanish cartoonist and illustrator Núria Tamarit, *Daughters of Snow and Cinders* conjures the awesome natural beauty of the frozen north in vibrant color. A rugged adventure story with two strong young women at its heart, this graphic novel offers a poignant message about the urgent need for humanity to overcome our greed and base impulses to be good stewards of the world in which we live and depend on.

NÚRIA TAMARIT is an illustrator and comic artist based in Valencia. Her graphic world is marked by fantastical elements, voluptuous plant forms, dreamy creatures, and powerful female characters. Her previous books include *Season of the Witch* (2020, with Matt Ralphs) and *Giantess* (2022, with Jean-Christophe Deveney).





Listen, Beautiful Márcia

A gripping story about a family pushed to the brink. This English language debut was the 2022 "Fauve d'Or" winner at the 2022 Angoulême Comics Festival.

Márcia is a nurse in a hospital near Rio and lives in a favela with her boyfriend, Aluisio, and her daughter, Jaqueline, whom she had very young with another man. Jaqueline, a troubled young adult, makes life difficult for her mother and Aluisio and rebelliously hangs out with members of a neighborhood gang, leading to violent altercations between mother and daughter. The situation degenerates even more when Jaqueline is arrested. Márcia and Aluisio, distraught, realize that Jaqueline is in deeper trouble than they ever thought.

Marcello Quintanilha's first English-language graphic novel is a tour de force — a tightly wound drama filled with masterful suspense and a deep love for family and character.



Goes Like This

By Jordan Crane

Collecting all of acclaimed cartoonist Jordan Crane's short stories (from self-published zines and anthologies such as *Non* and *Uptight*) and more for the first time, in a gorgeously designed package.

For almost three decades, Jordan Crane has put together a body of short stories that garnered him multiple Eisner and Ignatz Award nominations, via the pages of his comic book series *Uptight* and the influential comics anthology, *Non*. Yet they have never been collected until now. Featuring over a dozen short stories (spanning multiple genres) published over the past 25 years, *Goes Like This* is a gorgeously packaged anthology (including varying paper stocks and rounded corners) from master cartoonist Jordan Crane.

"The Hand of Gold" is a short but grim Weird Western, a morality play in which an accidental crime leads a criminal to a maximum, supernatural sanction. "Below the Shade of Night" presents an anxiety that is rooted in the follies and ignorance of childhood, adolescence and young adulthood. "Vicissitude" maps uncharted territory of graphic melancholia via

a tale of infidelity. "Trash Night" depicts the troubled relationship of Dee and Leo, with mounting tension and mistrust that reaches a boiling point. In "The Dark Nothing," a rare foray into science fiction, the three-person crew of prospecting ship Sagasu 17 attempt to harvest an asteroid, and things go horribly awry. "The Middle Nowhere" begins with a man waiting in a small shack. All around him is a black sand desert. The wind rises, the rain comes, and it just might be the end of everything he's known. Also featuring additional prints and drawings from the author's archives, *Goes Like This* is a tantalizing sampler of one of the most brilliant cartoonists working today.

JORDAN CRANE (Los Angeles, CA) has been one of the most quietly influential comics-makers of the past quarter-century — in multiple senses of the word: as a cartoonist, a designer, an editor, a publisher, a printmaker, an advocate, an archivist, and more.

Dear Mini: A Graphic Memoir, Book One


A vivid debut graphic memoir of adolescent resiliency.


This debut graphic memoir (the first of two books, with *Book Two* coming in 2025) is a bittersweet coming of age story that chronicles the author's teenage experiences with sexual assault, PTSD, and resiliency. *Dear Mini* is not a cautionary tale; rather, it is a vivid (at turns hilariously and uncomfortably so) depiction of adolescent agency in the face of trauma, tracing Norris's journey from wayward wild-child to resilient adult who has harnessed her voice.

Told in the form of an illustrated letter to an old friend, *Dear Mini* recounts the author's experience going abroad to attend a language immersion program in France after her sophomore year of high school. She meets Mini, an Austrian student who shares her predilection for illicit adventure, and the two quickly form a bond that they expect to last well after they go their separate ways. But when Natalie visits Mini ten months after their last face-to-


face, something has changed. Their nocturnal exploits veer head-on into disaster. Norris's spirited and free-flowing page designs and full color cartooning bring her frank voice and personality to life, making *Dear Mini* one of the most compelling memoir debuts of 2023.

The Planetoid And Other Stories

By Joe Orlando with Al Feldstein; Foreword by Paul Levitz

Joe Orlando's premiere EC science fiction collection!

Joe Orlando partnered early with Wallace Wood on a variety of science fiction comics, including several for EC Comics. But he quickly made a name for himself and struck out on his own, carving out a long and distinguished career in American comics.

Orlando became a mainstay at EC, especially on science fiction, and *The Planetoid And Other Stories* collects his first two dozen. All of them, scripted by editor/writer Al Feldstein, serve up classic O. Henry-style shock endings, including a mind-bending time-travel twister in which a man visits the past and (unknowingly) romances his own mother (think about it), a gender-switching look at a future where women are the breadwinners and men are the homemakers, another future where marriages are limited by law to three-year contracts, a good old-fashioned "planets collide" shocker, an animal rights parable, plus lots of rollicking space

opera, aliens, and, of course, interplanetary monsters (some of them human).

This volume also includes a complete reproduction of EC's special issue devoted to its own 32-page "illustrated, factual flying saucer report," with art by Orlando, Wallace Wood, George Evans, and Reed Crandall. Plus, a heartfelt foreword by former DC publisher Paul Levitz, who began his career in comics when Orlando hired him as an assistant, an introduction by Thommy Burns, and featured essays and commentary by EC experts.

JOE ORLANDO (1927–1998; Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame, 2007) became one of EC's top science fiction/fantasy illustrators in the early 1950s. ALBERT B. FELDSTEIN (1928–2014; Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame, 2003) was a triple-threat writer, artist, and editor, renowned for his work on such titles as Weird Science, Tales From the Crypt, and Mad magazine. He received the Bram Stoker Lifetime Achievement Award in 2011. PAUL LEVITZ (b. 1956; Will Eisner Award Hall of Fame, 2019) is a 47-year veteran of DC Comics, seven of them as publisher. He is also a noted editor and writer (Legion of Super-Heroes) and has received both the Bob Clampett Humanitarian Award and the Dick Giordano Hero Initiative Humanitarian of the Year Award.




Minami's Lover


In this raunchy, moving, funny manga for adults, high school student Minami's girlfriend, Chiyomi, shrinks down to six inches tall—and moves in with him!


Originally appearing in the underground/alternative manga magazine *Garo* in the 1980s and adapted for television several times, the Japanese pop culture sensation *Minami's Lover* is the story of two high schoolers' romantic relationship when one of them shrinks down to six inches tall. Everyone thinks Chiyomi has disappeared, and suspicion naturally falls on Minami, identified as her boyfriend in her diary. But after inexplicably finding herself in such a state, Chiyomi moves in with him. As depicted in Uchida's clean, loose line and Zip-a-Tone textures, the two soon adapt to the unusual circumstances, devising ways for Chiyomi to use the toilet, brush her teeth and hair, attend classes, and more. After some silly sequences of trial and error, they even figure out a sex life. But in addition to learning how to navigate logistics, jealousy, and the cat, they're also growing up (if not taller). Uchida uses the conceit of a teen couple literally learning how to take care of one another to examine gender dynamics and intimacy.

Born in Nagasaki, Japan, **shungiku uchida** (the pen name of Shigeko Uchida) is a prolific writer, mangaka, singer, and actress whose work is widely adapted into film and television.





















Anaïs Nin: A Sea of Lies


In lithe, sensuous colored pencils, this international prize-winning, impressionistic graphic biography traces the life, the affairs, and the artistic process of Anaïs Nin, one of the best-known authors of women's erotica in the 1920s and '30s.

Anaïs Nin, the author of works such as *Delta of Venus* and *House of Incest*, is the patron saint of taboo-breaking pop culture sexual iconoclasts. Not only is she an inspiration for contemporary figures such as Madonna, but her oeuvre, which encompasses erotica, autobiography, essays, short fiction, novels, and much more, has been adapted into film (*Henry and June*), television (*Little Bird*), and other media.

The cartoonist Léonie Bischoff traces the life of the prolific writer in this lushly colored graphic novel. It begins with Nin struggling to reconcile the man she married (who had artistic aspirations) with the banker she finds herself living with in the Parisian suburbs. Soon,


her obsession with June Miller leads to inspiration. Nin's life and art, the truth and fiction, are further intertwined as she recounts her many sexual liaisons including those with Henry Miller (whom she and her husband subsidize so he can write the controversial *Tropic of Cancer*), her psychoanalysts, and even her father. Although Bischoff's drawing is largely representational, she occasionally depicts Nin's sexual experiences in scenes as surreal as Nin's own written portrayal of them.

Swiss cartoonist **Léonie Bischoff** received a diploma in comics from the Saint-Luc Institute in Brussels, where she still lives. *Anaïs Nin: A Sea of Lies*, her 2020 graphic biography, won the Audience Favorite prize at the Angoulême International Comics Festival. Other works include *Hoodoo Darlin'*, *Princess Suplex*, and more. She is a member of the Comics Creators Against Sexism Collective.





All One Life

By Jon Strongbow

In stunning 3D imagery, *All One Life* is an imaginative collection of postcolonial, spiritually inflected images portraying the city of Seattle's past and present.

Inspired by a 3-page comic by the French cartoonist Jean Giraud (Moebius) illustrating a speech by Chief Seattle, Seattle-based cartoonist Jon Strongbow went on a spiritual journey. He studied at the Red Cedar Circle, a community dedicated to the ancient teachings of the First Peoples of the Northwest Coast, attended a local Tibetan monastery, and was mentored by local native healers and medicine people. Deeply moved by these teachings, he sought to honor the

culture of the original inhabitants and refute the devastation wrought upon them by depicting today's Seattle — named after a Duwamish chief — imbued with ghosts of the original inhabitants of Northwest Coastal natives.

All One Life is a series of 29 stunningly imaginative images — meticulously rendered and expertly transformed into 3D (glasses required and included) — that juxtapose the city's past and present, indicating what we have lost by destroying the tribal nations. Many of the images feature masked dancers from all over the world and how they invigorate the modern streets. There are also shamanic images, especially spirit entities, such as the dream time Wandjina spirits of Australia and the Hopi and Zuni Kachina's in the Four Corners area. Strongbow also showcases endangered species: a whale swims in the streets of Pioneer Square, echoing their near extinction caused by aggressive whaling by Americans, Germans, and Japanese; dinosaurs roam the city's streets, reminding us that many creatures have had their day, and we may have had ours. All One Life is a series of stunning images chronicling the transformation of Seattle that is both imaginatively fanciful and profoundly elegiac.






Okinawa brings together two collections of intertwined stories by the island's pre-eminent mangaka, Susumu Higa, which reflect on this difficult history and pull together traditional Okinawan spirituality, the modern-day realities of the continuing US military occupation, and the senselessness of the War. The first collection, Sword of Sand, is a ground level, unflinching look at the horrors of the Battle of Okinawa. Higa then turns an observant eye to the present-day in Mabui (Okinawan for "spirit"), where he explores how

the American occupation has irreversibly changed the island prefecture, through the lens of the archipelago's indigenous spirituality and the central character of the yuta priestess.

Okinawa is a harrowing document of war, but it is also a work which addresses the dreams and the needs of a people as they go forward into an uncertain future, making it essential reading for anyone interested in World War II and its effects on our lives today, as well as anyone with an interest in the people and culture of this fascinating, complicated place. Though the work is thoroughly about one specific locale, the complex relations between Okinawan and Japanese identities and loyalties, between place and history, and between humanity and violence speak beyond borders and across shores.

Winner of the Japan Media Arts Grand Prize in the manga division and nominated for the Tezuka Award and the FIBD Fauve d'Or, **susumu HIGA** was born in Okinawa in 1953, and continues to make it his home to this day.



















GILBERT HERNANDEZ co-created, in 1982, the ongoing internationally acclaimed comic book series *Love and Rockets*. In addition to his work on L&R, its spinoffs, and side series, Hernandez has released a prodigious amount of original graphic novels and miniseries. He was inducted into the Will Eisner Hall of Fame in 2017 and is the recipient of a Fellow Award from United States Artists and a PEN Center USA's Graphic Literature Award for Outstanding Body of Work. He lives in Ventura, CA, with his wife and daughter.



As each chapter highlights a new character in the ensemble, the game's impact grows as the world becomes consumed by fantasy.

Coming off the heels of their acclaimed queer comics *Can-nonball* and *Crimes, Eden II* is Wroten's magnum opus, establishing them as a breakout graphic novelist. Philosophical, sarcastic, self-assured, *Eden II* is a vital work of the moment that positions

Wroten alongside recent comics luminaries like Emily Carroll, Caroline Cash, Isabel Greenberg, Melanie Gilman, and Tillie Walden. Reminiscent of the stylized angst of Gregg Araki and Jamie Babbit's works, Wroten's imagery in *Eden II* reflects the blighted pastiche of Andrei Tarkovsky's *Stalker* — and they have suffused that pastiche with a dark sense of humor and technologically enhanced moral ambiguity.

A graduate of the Kansas City Art Institute with a BFA in Illustration, and originally from Kansas City, MO, **KENNY WROTEN** is a Brooklyn-based artist. Their work has appeared in *The New Yorker, The New York Times, Vice, Them,* and many other publications. *Cannonball* (2019) won the Lambda Literary Award for Best LGBTQ Graphic Novel and their graphic novella *Crimes* won the 2019 MoCCA Arts Festival Award of Excellence.

Spain's answer to *Seinfeld*, these observational, relatable autobio vignettes by Spanish cartoonist Paco Roca poke fun at the vexing tribulations of modern life.

At 40, cartoonist Paco Roca has finally achieved his childhood dream — to spend all day at home in his pajamas! However, his blissful, loungewear-clad reverie is beset with a host of mundane problems: He dreads small talk with "the world's biggest bore," but his excuses and white lies are finally catching up with him. When good friends break up, taking either side could lead to social disaster. The simple mission to change his train ticket descends into an impossibly complicated, Kafkaesque affair. And worst of all, his partner keeps hanging the toilet paper roll the wrong way!

In the vein of sitcoms like *Seinfeld* and *Curb Your Enthusiasm*, Roca's comic vignettes brilliantly satirize the pesky pitfalls of modern-day life. Like most of us, Roca's alter ego just wants to be liked

and to do the right thing, but finds that through crippling indecision, cowardly behavior, and the absurd machinations of the universe, he is usually thwarted. The ensuing situations he finds himself embroiled in are as hilarious as they are often painfully relatable.

PACO ROCA is a cartoonist and illustrator whose works have won a variety of awards, including Spain's National Comics Prize in 2008. Fantagraphics has published English editions of several of his graphic novels, including *Wrinkles, Twists of Fate, The House, The Winter of the Cartoonist,* and *The Treasure of the Black Swan*.
