

Thirteen-year-old Paul lives between the two Paris apartments of his broken family, looked after by a Filipino babysitter who hasn't seen her own children in years. When Paul meets Scarlett, a beguiling classmate, he uncovers the cruel gulf between the world as it is and how he imagined it to be. It's only a matter of time before Paul witnesses a shocking event and inherits a burden he's far too young to shoulder.



## The Winter Station by Jody Shields- Little, Brown- 978-0-316-38534-3- HC- \$35.00- Fiction-304 pp.- January 2018

1910: people are mysteriously dying at an alarming rate in the Russian-ruled city of Kharbin, a major railway outpost in Northern China. Strangely, some of the dead bodies vanish before they can be identified. The Baron, a wealthy Russian aristocrat and the city's medical commissioner, is determined to stop this mysterious plague. His allies include a French doctor, a black marketeer, and a charismatic Chinese dwarf. His greatest refuge is the intimacy he shares with his young Chinese wife - but she has secrets of her own.




#### One For the Rock by Kevin Major Breakwater Books- 978-1-550816877- TPB-\$19.95- Fiction- 192 pp.- February 2018


#### The Which Way Tree by Elizabeth Crook- Little, Brown- 978-0-316-43495-9- HC- \$34.00-Fiction- 256 pp.- February 2018

Early one morning in the remote hill country of Texas, a panther savagely attacks a family of homesteaders, mauling a young girl named Samantha and killing her mother, whose final act is to save her daughter's life. Samantha and her half-brother, Benjamin, survive, but she is left traumatized, her face horribly scarred. Narrated in Benjamin's beguilingly plainspoken voice, *The Which Way Tree* is the story of Samantha's unshakeable resolve to stalk and kill the infamous panther, rumored across the Rio Grande to be a demon, and avenge her mother's death.



### Down the River unto the Sea by Walter Mosley- Mulholland Books- 978-0-316-50964-0-HC- \$35.00- Fiction- 336 pp.- February 2018

Joe King Oliver was one of the NYPD's finest investigators until he was framed for assault and imprisoned in solitary at Rikers Island. A decade later, King is a private detective, running his agency with the help of his teenage daughter. When he receives a card in the mail from the woman who admits she was paid to frame him those years ago, King realizes that he has no choice but to take his own case: figuring out who on the force wanted him disposed of--and why.

What if our homes could tell the stories of others who lived there before us? Set in a small village near Paris, *The Balcony* follows the inhabitants of a single estate-including a manor and a servants' cottage-over the course of several generations, from the Belle Époque to the present day, introducing us to a fascinating cast of characters.

Soon after arriving for his honeymoon at the Tower of Babel, Thomas Senlin, gets separated from his wife, Marya, in the overwhelming swarm of tourists, residents, and miscreants. Senlin is determined to find Marya, but to do so he'll have to navigate madhouses, ballrooms, and burlesque theaters and survive betrayal, assassins, and the illusions of the Tower.

In 1901, Evelyn Nesbit, the pin-up girl and penniless young actress, dined with Stanford White, the legendary architect whose works defined the New York landscape. Four years later, Evelyn would marry Harry Thaw, a playboy millionaire rumored to be mentally unstable. One night in 1906, a vengeful Thaw shot and killed White during a performance at Madison Square Garden-a venue designed by none other than White himself. The city-and the nation that looked to iterupted with news of the murder and ensuing trial, then the most sensational scandal in history.
