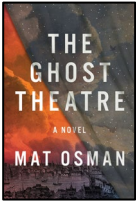

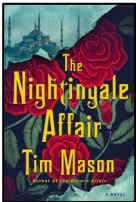
Bridge by Lauren Beukes- Mulholland Books- 9780316267885- HC- \$37.00- Thriller- 432 pp.- August 2023

A grieving daughter's search for her mother becomes a journey across alternate realities in this wildly entertaining, reality-bending thriller from the author of *The Shining Girls*.



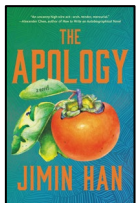

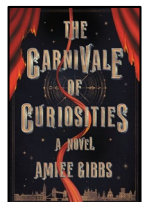
The Apology by Jimin Han- Little, Brown- 9780316367080- HC- \$35.00- Literary Fiction- 304 pp.- August 2023
